FUHSI COMMENCES 2023/2024 ACADEMIC SESSION

he Federal University of Health Sciences, Ila-Orangun has begun the 2023/2024 academic session. The session, which started on January 8, 2024, welcomed both returning students and freshmen to the academically charged campus of the University. The newly admitted students and the vets began to meet their respective departmental representatives to register their details. This marked the start of the formal enrollment processes and official acceptance into the University community for the freshmen. FUHSI Bulletin can report that out of the 853 students offered admission by the Institution, only 576 have accepted the offer of admission according to the University's database as at the time of filing this report. The Management and staff of the University remained dedicated to providing high-quality education and a conducive environment for learning and innovation in Health Sciences.



MDCN ASSESSES MEDICAL COLLEGE'S FACILITIES AHEAD OF ACCREDITATION

he Medical and Dental Council of Nigeria (MDCN) has visited the Federal University of Health Sciences, Ila Orangun (FUHSI) to evaluate the facilities of the College of Medicine in preparation for the accreditation of the U n i v e r s i t y ' s M e d i c a l p r o g r a m m e s. The MDCN team, led by Dr T.A.B. Sanusi engaged the Management of the University, in an advisory session

to provide insights and guidance on the most effective way to train the students on the best practices for medicine, dentistry, and alternative medicine towards ensuring that experts were churned out to give Nigerians the greatest possible healthcare delivery. Sanusi described the MDCN team's visit as a statutory duty to foster collaborations and exchange of ideas. "Our visit is to ensure strict adherence to guidelines for training Medical and Dental professionals and to enhance teaching quality, learning outcomes, and professionalism which will help to nurture world-class medical and dental practitioners, Sanusi explained. "The MDCN prioritises that universities provide adequate facilities and equipment to smoothen a seamless and effective education for Medical and Dental students", he added. During the visit to the University's permanent site and after inspecting the facilities, equipment, and ongoing projects, the team commended the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Akeem Lasisi, for the location chosen for the University's Teaching Hospital. The team noted that the Hospital would be easily accessible to patients from the larger society while it appreciated its potential benefits to the University community. Cont. on Page 2

FUHSI RECEIVES MODERN CLINICAL AUDIOMETER

he Coalition of Global Hearing Health (CGHH) has presented a modern clinical audiometer to the Department of Audiology of the Federal University of Health Sciences Ila-Orangun (FUHSI). An anonymous source told FUHSI Bulletin that the donated clinical audiometer was a response to the Vice Chancellor, Prof Akeem Olawale Lasisi's, appeal to the Coalition of Global Hearing Health (CGHH) at the 13th Annual Conference held in Los Angeles, California, USA on October 19th -23rd 2023. The high-precision diagnostic capability clinical audiometer was a userfriendly machine with an interface for accurate and efficient assessments and cutting-edge technology built to ensure reliable results. The audiometer would help the Audiology Department in its mandate to train the students and its mission to promote ear and hearing healthcare. It would also assist audiologists diagnose individuals with hearing impairment and carry out research on ear and hearing problems.

FUHSI PARTNERS NSCDC: PLAN ENHANCED CAMPUS SECURITY

The Federal University of Health Sciences, Ila-Orangun (FUHSI) collaborates with the Nigeria Security and Civil Defence Corps (NSCDC) to ensure the safety of its staff and students on campus. In a meeting held on February 27th, 2024 in the Vice-Chancellor's office had in attendance the NSCDC Area Commander, Mr. Akinola M. Olusola (ACC), and other NSCDC officials. Mr. Akinola emphasised the importance of the partnership between FUHSI and NSCDC, saying that the University community required a security-threat-free atmosphere to thrive. He highlighted the implication of the FUHSI-NSCDC collaboration for a safe school sensitisation while adding that combating issues such as drug abuse, travel safety precautions, social associations and other social vices among students are security challenges that were often easily ignored.In his words, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Akeem Lasisi, said that "I doubt if there is anyone who is not concerned about the security situation in the country. It is, therefore, our responsibility to ensure safety at all cost" He assured the Area Commander and his team of the University's readiness to collaborate with NSCDC for a safe University environment, especially considering its location and future expansion plans. In his address, the Registrar, Mr Kassim Kayode Babamale, emphasised the need for proactive measures. Babamale, stated that "Because of the security challenges, one cannot fold his hands and expect everything t o b e fine.

FUHSI GETS TWO NEW BUSES


