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FUHSI LECTURER URGES PROPER FOOD PREPARATION FOR OPTIMAL NUTRITION

he Head of the Department of Human Nutrition and Dietetics at the Federal University of Health Sciences, Ila-Orangun (FUHSI), Dr Ifeoluwa Pele, has emphasised the importance of proper food preparation in achieving optimal nutrition and wellness.

Speaking at a faculty workshop organised by the Faculty of Allied Health Sciences, Dr Pele advised members of the university and the host community to pay close attention to how their meals are prepared. He noted that cooking methods can significantly impact nutrient retention and overall health outcomes.

The workshop titled "Human Health and Wellness: The Interconnectedness of Food, Nutrients, and Diet," was held to raise awareness about the critical role of nutrition in human health. Dr Pele's presentation focused on how food combinations and preparation techniques can either enhance or reduce the nutritional value of meals. He encouraged participants to be mindful of not just what they eat but also of how they prepare their food. Also speaking at the event, the Provost of the College of Medicine, Prof. Akibu Oyelami, highlighted the importance of a balanced diet, particularly the regular intake of fruits and vegetables. He stressed the roles of a balanced diet in preventing chronic diseases and maintaining long-term health.

He further encouraged participants to plant green leafy vegetables and trees within their compounds. He noted that such practices contribute to cleaner, hazard-free air and a healthier environment.
